At a Regular Term of the Supreme Court of Appeals continued and held at Charleston, Kanawha County on the 26th day of June, 1985, the following order was made and entered, to-wit:

In Re: Dennis H. Curry L.E.C. 85-06

On a former day, to-wit, June 18, 1985, came Edmund C. Stone, Chairman of the West Virginia State Bar, Committee on Legal Ethics, and presented to the Court the report and recommendation of the Committee on Legal Ethics of the West Virginia State Bar, submitting the petition and affidavit of Dennis H. Curry consenting to his disbarment pursuant to the provisions of Article VI, Part E., Section 27 of the By-Laws of the West Virginia State Bar, and moving that an order be entered disbarring the defendant by consent in accordance with the provisions of said article. Upon consideration of which, the Court is of opinion to, and doth hereby, grant said motion.

Accordingly, it is adjudged and ordered that the license of Dennis H. Curry, to practice law in the State of West Virginia, be, and the same is hereby, revoked and annulled.

It is further ordered that the Clerk promptly certify a copy of this order to the Director of the West Virginia State Bar and that a duly attested copy be served upon the defendant, Dennis H. Curry, according to law.
