On a former day, to-wit, August 30, 1990, came the respondent, Arch A. Moore, Jr., by Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer & Feld, Larry S. Gondelman, and William G. Hundley, his attorneys, and also came the complainant, The West Virginia State Bar, by Sherri D. Goodman, its attorney, and presented to the Court their joint motion to continue the oral argument in the above-styled proceeding from the 11th day of September, 1990, to a date to be determined, and to suspend the license of the respondent to practice of law in the State of West Virginia pending disposition of his appeal to the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit of his conviction in the United States District Court for the Southern District of West Virginia pursuant to his plea of guilty to a five-count indictment.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby grant said motion. It is therefore ordered that this matter be set for oral argument on a date to be determined by the Court. It is further ordered that the

respondent's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia be, and it hereby is, suspended pending disposition of his appeal to the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit of his conviction in the United States District Court for the Southern District of West Virginia pursuant to his plea of guilty to a five-count indictment.
