At a Regular Term of the Supreme Court of Appeals continued and held at Charleston, Kanawha County, on the 6th day of October, 1994, the following order was made and entered:

On a former day, to-wit, August 12, 1994, came the complainant, the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by Sherri D. Goodman, its attorney, and presented to the Court its written recommended disposition, pursuant to Rule 3.10 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, together with the Hearing Panel's adoption of the Subcommittee Report and the Subcommittee Report, and a certificate of expenses in the amount of One Thousand Thirty-Two Dollars and Twenty-Six Cents (\$1,032.26).

There being heard neither objection nor concurrence from the respondent pursuant to Rule 3.11, Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, it is hereby ordered that the written recommended disposition of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board be, and it hereby is, adopted. It is therefore ordered that the respondent's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia be, and it hereby is, suspended for a period of three years, effective on the 5th day of November, 1994, plus restitution in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). It is further ordered that the respondent must follow all procedures for reinstatement under Rule 3.32 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure and submit a plan of supervision for one year. It is further ordered that the respondent not be reinstated without having undergone meaningful and substantial

counseling or therapy with any counsellor to be approved by the Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel. It is finally ordered that the respondent reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for the expenses incurred in the investigation of this matter in the amount of One Thousand Thirty-Two Dollars and Twenty-Six Cents (\$1,032.26). Justice Cleckley deemed himself disqualified. Chief Justice Brotherton absent.
