The Court, having maturely considered the petition and the oral argument and briefs of counsel thereon, is of opinion for reasons stated in writing and filed with the record to deny the petition for reinstatement to the practice of law in the State of West Virginia of the petitioner, Arch A. Moore, Jr. It is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that petitioner's petition to be reinstated to the practice of law in the State of West Virginia be, and it hereby is, denied; all of which is ordered to be certified to the West Virginia Board of Law Examiners.

The syllabus of points adjudicated, prefixed to the written opinion aforesaid, prepared Per Curiam, was concurred in by Judge Frye, sitting by temporary assignment. Chief Justice Starcher and Justices Davis and Maynard, and Judges Pancake, sitting by temporary assignment, concur and reserve the right to file separate opinions. Justices McGraw and Albright deemed themselves disqualified and did not participate in the consideration or decision of this matter.
