On a former day, to-wit, January 25, 1996, came the petitioner, Thomas L. Craig, Jr., a suspended member of The West Virginia State Bar, pro se, pursuant to rule 3.32(a), Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court his petition for the reinstatement of his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia. Thereafter, on the 8th day of February, 1996, this Court referred the matter to the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for review and recommendation. Finally, on the 15th day of March, 1996, came the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by Sherri D. Goodman, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, pursuant to Rule 3.32(b), Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court its written recommendation recommending that the license of the petitioner, Thomas L. Craig, Jr., to practice law in the State of West Virginia, be reinstated.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court doth hereby adopt the recommendation of the Office of Disciplinary Counsel. It is hereby ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the petitioner, Thomas L. Craig,
