
On a former day, to-wit, February 3, 1995, came the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by R. Kemp Morton, its chairman, pursuant to Rule 3.10, Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court its written recommended disposition recommending an additional three-month suspension of the respondent's, William E. Kiger, a suspended member of The West Virginia State Bar, license to practice law in the State of West Virginia, said suspension to run consecutive to the six-month suspension imposed by this Court's order entered on the 6th day of January, 1995, and that he reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for any expenses incurred in this matter.

There being heard neither consent nor objection by the respondent or by the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby adopt the written recommended disposition of the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board. It is therefore ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, William E. Kiger, be, and it hereby is, suspended for an additional three months to run consecutive to the suspension entered on the 6th day of January, 1995, and effective on the 16th day of January, 1995. It is

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further ordered that the respondent reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for any expenses incurred in the investigation of this matter. Chief Justice Neely and Justice Brotherton absent. Judge Fred L. Fox, II, sitting by temporary assignment.
