ORDER

On October 29, 2019, the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by Andrea J. Hinerman, Senior Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, pursuant to Rule 3.25 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, presented to the Court its petition praying for the Court to accept the annulment of the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Timothy M. Sirk, along with the formal affidavit, under seal, of the respondent consenting to voluntary disbarment.
